


Reunion History

The first Burditt Reunion held September 23, 1905 was a gathering of the descendants of George and Sarah, as well as friends and neighbors. Although referred to as the BURDITT REUNION, as originally it was known, today most descendants of George Burditt, spell their BURDITT surname, BURDETT or BURDETTE.




Directions to the 2019 Burditt Reunion:

From the North (Rochester/Buffalo): I-390 South to exit 4 – Turn right onto Route 36 South towards Stony Brook. Go 14 miles (past Stony Brook). Turn right on Webbs Crossing Rd. 0.3 mi turn left onto North Main Street extension. 2.0 miles hard right onto Schoolhouse Rd (look for sign to Wildwood BOCES). 0.2 mi turn right onto Bald Hill Rd. 0.6 of a mi turn right onto Burdett Rd.

From the Southeast (Bath/Binghamton): I-86 West (aka Rt. 17) to exit 34S which is Route 36 South. Right onto Webbs Crossing Rd. Then see above for directions "From the North".

From the Southwest (Alfred/Hornell): I-86 East (aka Rt. 17) to Exist 34S onto Route 36 South towards Hornell. Then see above directions "From the North"






ATTENTION CAMPERS

There is plenty of room for camping trailers and tents for those who want to spend the weekend or the night before the reunion. No reservations required!




SOME HISTORICAL POINTS OF INTEREST in Nearby DANSVILLE NY ...

2. Site of **1905** Burditt Reunion (Then home of Lorenzo and Abbie (Burditt) Hulbert). Known as 'Hedgehurst' the land was first purchased by Lorenzo's father, Julius Hulbert in 1831. After his death in 1874 his son Lorenzo, took ownership of the farm and resided there until about 1920 when he transferred ownership to his children L. Clyde Hulbert and Lena H. Smith. They rented the farmhouse and land in the 1920's and early 1930's and about this time a fire started after a hot iron fell over. The house burned to the ground and was never rebuilt. Today there is just an open field where the Federal style Hulbert home once stood. There are photos of 'Hedgehurst' on the [www. 3. 1873 home of James B. Curry (father-in-law of Paul S. Burditt and James B. Hendee). Mr. Curry settled there in 1835 and died there in 1884 owning over 150 acres of fine farmland. After his death, his son Charles O. Curry continued to farm there for many years.
4. 1873 home of Nehemiah Wallace (father of Earl Wilbur Wallace. Wilbur Wallace married Eva Allen, daughter of Philetus and Almeda Allen)
5. 1873 home of George Willey, Jr. (father of George E. Willey. George E. Willey married Nellie Allen, daughter of Philetus and Almeda Allen)
6. 1873 home of Philetus and Almeda (Burditt) Allen. Almeda, the daughter of George and Milly Burditt, wrote the first Burditt Reunion history of 1905. Philetus' father, Leeds Allen, settled in 1815 on what is now the southeast corner of Dunn and Bridge Road. He remained there until his death in 1865. His son Philetus owned a 193-acre farm north of his
