


Lewis Wallman & on his solemn oath
swore according to law saith that he enlisted
at York in the service of the United States
in the year 1778 or thereabouts in Capt. Bush's
Company of the 6th Pennsylvania Cavalry then under
Col. Butler & served three years & one half
& was frequently discharged, a part of his
discharge being remitted attached. That
he is a resident citizen of the United States
and from his reduced circumstances in life
& in need of assistance from his country for
support. That he is aged about 60 years
& further saith he was the depositor
of the above & subscriber this date
Day of October 10th 1800

On this seventh day of August 1820, personally appeared, in open court, Lewis Wattman aged 62 years, resident in said county, who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his solemn oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows: viz... I was in the 6th Regiment Pennsylvania line commanded by Col. Butler in the company commanded by Capt. Bush from the fall of the year 1777 until the end of three years and a half, as well as all after that time now living at the pension office. That the date of his original application for a pension is October 1818, and the number of his pension certificate 10,504. And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States, on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of the act of congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the Revolutionary war," passed on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property, or securities, contracts, or debts, due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed. viz... Real property none - one cow value \$10.00 two pigs \$1.00 one total \$0.50 one shirt \$0.50 and a few articles of kitchen furniture value \$41.00 my trade is that of a cooper but I am lame in one of my arms and unable to work. I have one little daughter at home with me who is of age my wife is unable to do any thing towards our support. I have no friends or relatives who are able to assist me
