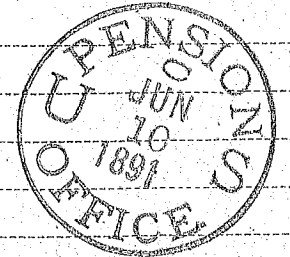

Invalid Pensions,

Under the Act of Congress, approved July 14th, 1862, will commence from the date of the Pensioner's discharge from service, provided application is made within one year thereafter. If the claim is not made until a later date, the pension will commence from the time of the application.

The claimant's identity must be proved by two witnesses;—certified by a judicial officer, to be respectable and credible, who are present and witness the signature of the declarant, and who state, upon oath or affirmation, their belief, either from personal acquaintance or for other reasons given, that he is the identical person he represents himself to be. Every applicant for an Invalid Pension must, if in his power, produce the certificate of the Captain, or of some other commissioned officer, under whom he served, distinctly stating the time and place of the said applicant having been wounded, or otherwise disabled, and the nature of the disability, and that the said disability arose while he was in the service of the United States and in the line of his duty.

If it be impracticable to obtain such certificate, by reason of the death or removal of said officers, it must be so stated under oath by the applicant, and his averment of the fact proved by persons of known res-

pectability, who must state particularly all the knowledge they may possess in relation to such death or removal; then secondary evidence can be received. In such case, the applicant must produce the testimony of at least two credible witnesses, (who were in a condition to know the facts about which they testify), whose good character must be vouched for by a judicial officer, or some one known to the Department. The witnesses must give a minute narrative of the facts in relation to the matter, and must show how they obtained a knowledge of the facts to which they testify. The Surgeon's certificate of discharge should show the character and degree of the claimant's disability; but when that is wanting, and when the certificate of an Army Surgeon is not obtainable, the certificate of two respectable civil Surgeons will be received in accordance with the form on the outside of this application. These Surgeons must give in their certificate a particular description of the wound, injury, or disease, and specify how and in what manner his present condition and disability are connected therewith. The degree of disability for obtaining subsistence by manual labor must also be stated.

The habits of the applicant, and his occupation, since he left the service, must be shown by at least two credible witnesses.

The surgeon should not recommend increase excepting for one of two reasons - that the present rating is unjustly low, or that the disability has really increased. In either case the reasons for changing the present rating should be clearly set forth, and should include a statement of the physical and rational signs.

The examination reveals the following conditions:

Ball entered right arm at a point three inches above bend of elbow, and just at outer edge of biceps, and, passing backward and outward, emerged from arm at a point three inches above and slightly behind external condyle of humerus. - The resulting cicatrices are somewhat adherent and the motions of the arm slightly impaired so that he cannot fully extend fore arm nor flex elbow so as to touch shoulder with hand. He complains of pain and weakness in the arm and of pain in the shoulder.

Present rating too low, -
Disability One fourth.

Judging from the condition and history of the claimant, it is Our opinion the disability was incurred in the service as claimed, and that it is not aggravated or protracted by vicious habits.

We find the disability as above described to entitle him to a One fourth rating.

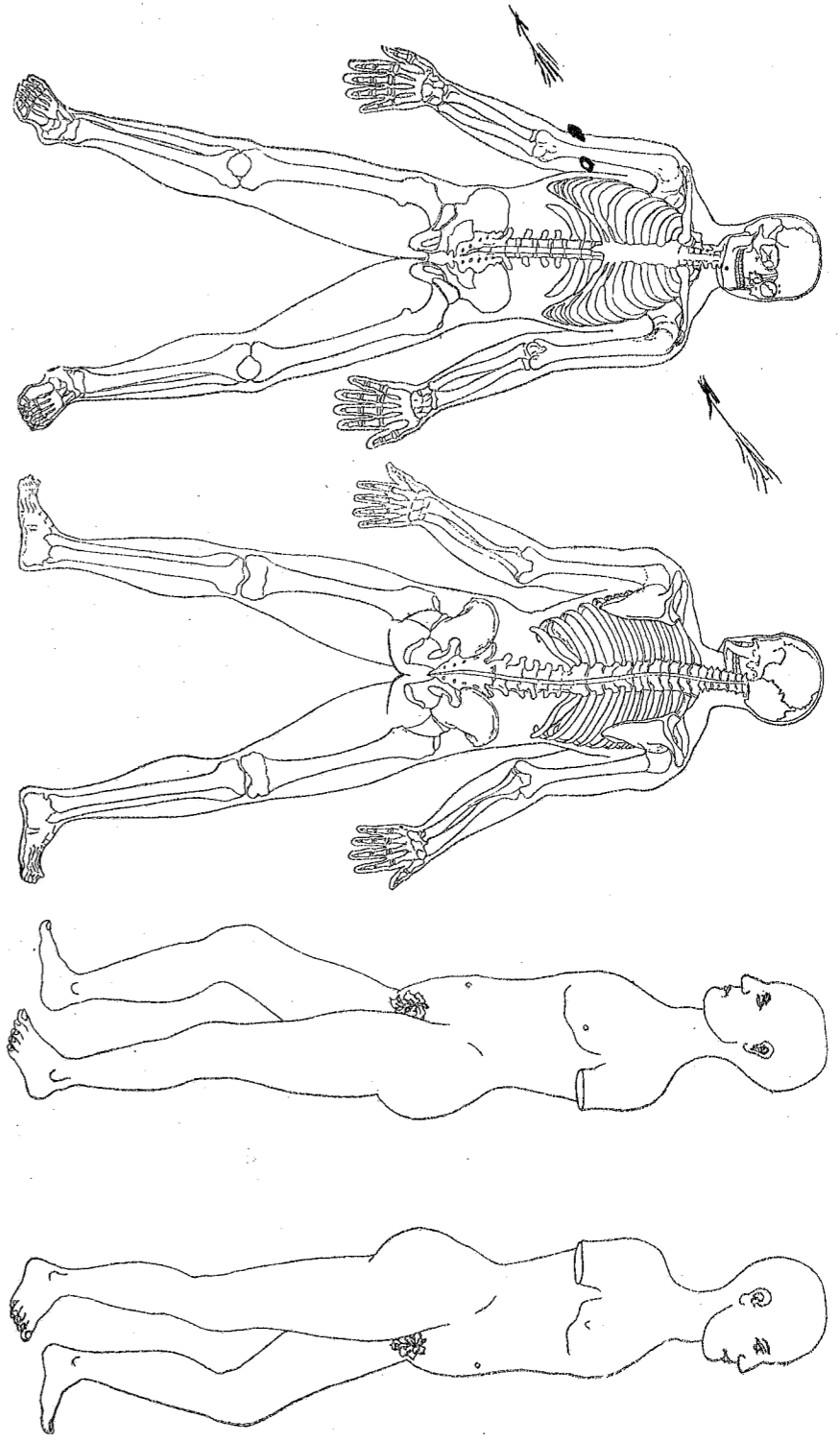
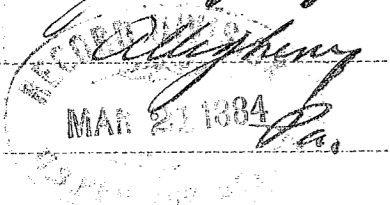

The applicant states that he is now paid at the agency for a One eighth disability, on account of G.S. W. of right arm, and that he applies for increase on the ground that that the present rating is unjustly low

That the present rating is unjustly low, or that there has been actual increase of the disability.

Particular description.

He states that he is 53 years of age, that he weighs 130 pounds, and that he is 5 feet 7 1/2 inches in height. His pulse-rate per minute is 76, his respiration 18, and his temperature normal

The surgeon should not recommend increase excepting for one of two reasons—that the present rating is unjustly low, or that the disability has really increased. In either case the reasons for changing the present rating should be clearly set forth, and should include a full statement of the physical and rational signs.

The examination reveals the following conditions:

Ball entered right arm at outer edge of biceps and about two inches above elbow joint, and, passing backward and slightly downward emerged from back of armpit, three inches from wound of entrance. The resulting cicatrices are somewhat adherent and slightly tender, and the grasp of the hand is slightly weakened. He complains of pain extending from wound to shoulder. Present rating too low. Disability one fourth.

This claimant also suffers from hemorrhoids, and he protracted these tumors, each about the size and shape of an almond, in presence of the Board. He claims that he contracted this while in the service of the United States.

Judging from the condition and history of the claimant, it is our opinion the disability was incurred in the service as claimed, and that it is not aggravated or protracted by vicious habits.

We find the disability as above described to entitle him to a one fourth rating.
