choice, The said cows sheep and hogs their numbers not to increase neither
is she to sell any of them she is also to have the use of the kitchen up stairs
with four bedsteads and necessary bedding The said Luanna my wife is
to take charge and provide for my eight Youngest Children until they
arrive at the age of fifteen Years and no longer she is also to send
the said Children to school steadily until they arrive at the age of
fifteen she is to receive the Interest of Eight Hundred Dollars Yearly

 to the distillery he is also to have the remaining part of the fullerton lot
 that is not sold to Wetsy also a lot on the Hill joining said lot also forty
 four acres in Alleghany County running along the road from Dansville to
 Shugart Creek being part of a lot sold to Jacob the several lots valued at
 one thousand three hundred and forty dollars out of which he is credited
 for five hundred dollars leaving a balance of Eight hundred and
 forty dollars to be paid to the Heir of the Estate he is to pay 125 dollars yearly
 till the whole is paid This applies to my orchards as soon as they shall bear
 my wife and youngest children the use of them or as many as they shall want

 with the harness they have been used to work in also the waggons
 bought last one plow and one harrow which he is at present in his use the whole
 valued at three hundred dollars I also bequeath and give to Jacob Hartman
 one pair of oxen which I now use and the light waggon one set plow churn -

and our silver and gold valued at Two Hundred dollars I also give and
bequeath to Henry one yoke or one not broke to the yoke one yoke and chain
valued at fifty dollars he is also to have the use of John's wagon until he is
able to buy one all my household furniture is to be valued and sold except
that which my wife wants for her own use and her divided into seven
equal shares (or) amongst John Geage Jacob and Sally Henry Polly and Ed
also the horse and horse furniture and farming utensils each of the above
mentioned children to receive one equal share agreeable to the above men-
tioned valuation also John is to provide sufficient fire wood for my wife
and do her milking also if required to furnish her with a horse to ride also
that none of my children is to sell the Land willed to them until the heirs
is bound off and if any of my children should die without heirs from
their own body the said Land so willed to said child shall return
back to my heirs also one year from my death my Executors shall
lay out the sum of five Hundred ^{dollars} in willed Land for each of my five
